Co-production: I will draw from my experience of working collaboratively with people with intellectual disability in inclusive research, which makes it necessary for both non-disabled researchers and co-researchers with intellectual disability to develop skills that ensure meaningful involvement in the research process. There are important principles to follow but no hard and fast rules. Doing research inclusively is therefore a creative process that must always be attentive to utilizing potential for growth and removing stumbling blocks.'
